

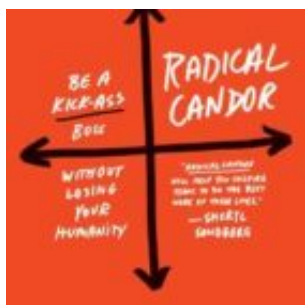
Business Book Group Discussion for 'Radical Candor' Wednesday at Darien Library
