The men of the choir will perform ancient Gregorian chant of the medieval church.

Evensong, one of the great liturgical legacies of Henry VIII and most cherished of Anglican services, has its origins in the ancient monastic (and before then, Jewish), tradition of marking the day with specific times of prayer.

When the Church of England severed its Roman ties, Archbishop Thomas Cranmer (1489 to 1556) condensed several traditional monastic services into Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer, called Matins and Evensong when sung.

The service is being conducted by David Pulliam, (director of music and organist at Saint Luke's). The service, held in the historic St. Luke's Parish church, is free of admission and open to everyone at [1864 Boston Post Rd., Darien](#).
