Full of delicious descriptions of coastal New England and richly imagined characters, "The Forever Summer" is an emotional, hot-topic page-turner.

Maile Meloy, author of "Do Not Become Alarmed" has created another story full of unexpected twists and turns.

When Liv and Nora decide to take their husbands and children on a holiday cruise, everyone is thrilled. But when they all go ashore for an adventure in Central America, the vacation turns into a nightmare when the children go missing.

The disintegration of the world the families knew — told from the perspectives of both the adults and the children — is both riveting and revealing.

Maile Meloy has written a gripping novel about how quickly what we count on can fall away, and the way a crisis shifts our perceptions of what matters most.

Jane Green, whose books are favorite summer fare, has a new novel, "The Sunshine Sisters," that Jojo Moyes calls her "best yet."

Ronni Sunshine left London for Hollywood to become a star of the silver screen. But at home, she was a narcissistic mother who cruelly alienated her three daughters.

As each sister leaves home to forge her own life, bitter scars fester. Years pass, and when Ronnie becomes seriously ill, they reunite and discover compassion and the unbreakable bond of family.

Written with wit and wisdom, “The Sunshine Sisters” is a psychologically compelling story.
