About the Book

In a world where so much is competing for a child's attention, how do you raise a reader? It's an accepted fact that reading is crucial for kids.

Study after study shows that babies and toddlers thrive intellectually and emotionally when they're read to and that books help children of every age expand their language skills and comprehension of the world, boost

their critical thinking and imagination, build empathy, and strengthen bonds with caregivers.

At the same time, reading can be a source of stress for parents:

- Which books should I read to my baby, and how early?
- Is my child reading soon enough, fast enough, in an advanced enough way?
- How can I teach my child to prioritize books over screens?
- What's the best way to use reading to give kids a 'head start' in today's competitive landscape?
- With everything else going on, how can I help my child carve out the time to dive headlong into a book?
- Is it too late to get a teenager into reading?

Written by two women who not only live and work in the world of books but are mothers of three children each (all of them very different kinds of readers), *How to Raise a Reader* provides insider know-how to parents searching for the tools to instill a lifelong love of reading in their children, setting them up for success in the larger world.

School is where children learn how to read. Home is where they can learn to love reading.
