Its intrinsic value may be trifling or great; but its real value is beyond price, for it is a precious symbol of all that we and our comrades have worked for and lived for, and died for—a free nation of free people, true to the faith of the past, devoted to the ideals and practice of Justice, Freedom, and Democracy.


