The Concert Choir performed beautifully and placed second place in their category and division with a Silver (Excellent) rating.

The orchestra, conducted by Jane Minnis, was awarded a Silver rating at the 2019 World Strides Heritage Music Festival. The Orchestra impressed the judges with their sound and balance and high level of orchestral literature.
