He made the best French toast, lasagna, and sweet yams with corn flakes. He gave his heart to everyone in every breath, every moment and every conversation.

He had a close circle of friends and a church community that provided a wonderful support system for him and he provided great strength and motivation to them, as well. He cared about his friends deeply and he will be sorely missed. The family would like to thank Dave's friends for all their love and support throughout the years.

He was predeceased by his niece Juliette Gidley, former father and mother in law John and Catherine Collins, and close friends Frank and Sheila Tchitcherine.
