Tyler Colman writes, talks and teaches about wine. His lively commentary and wine recommendations have attracted a significant following and his writing has set the agenda on crucial topics and earned him a nomination for a James Beard foundation award. Colman, who writes online under the pen name Dr. Vino, is a real doctor — he doesn't just play one on the Internet.

He wrote his doctoral dissertation at Northwestern University on the political economy of the wine industry that served as the basis of his first book, *Wine Politics: How Governments, Environmentalists, Mobsters and Critics Influence the Wines We Drink*.

His second book is chock-a-block with wine recommendations, plotted to the seasons. He taught wine classes for ten years at NYU and five years at the University of Chicago.

In print, Colman's wine writing has appeared in *The New York Times*, *Food & Wine*, *Wine & Spirits*, *Wine*

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Business Monthly, Bicycling magazine, The World of Fine Wine, and The Oxford Companion to Wine.

He currently advises clients on wine collections and conducts private events. He also oversees the razor-sharp wine list at Parlor Pizza in Wilton.

Our very special guest will be Raj Parr, the acclaimed former sommelier, who currently makes the wines at Sandhi and Domaine de la Cote. He has co-authored two wine books and was honored as a “Who’s Who, Food & Beverage” in 2017 by the James Beard Foundation.
