

'Navigating Contemporary Art' Lecture Series Continues at Darien Community Association

All art is in dialogue with other art, says Wall Street Journal art critic Lance Esplund, who continues his lecture series on modern art on Thursday, Oct. 24 at the Darien Community Association.

Esplund, author of *The Art of Looking: How to Read Modern and Contemporary Art* will start his lecture, “Navigating Contemporary Art” at 11 a.m.

“Artists might explore an ancient myth, the experience of a kiss, the disasters of war, unrequited love, or the tensions between two rectangles — but no matter what their subjects, they are all speaking with the same vocabulary and the same elements of art,” Esplund says.

What can be the conundrum of contemporary art is deconstructed under the framework that artists, whether working abstractly, representationally or conceptually---are in a constant process of revitalizing and extending the language and vocabulary of art to tell their story, and lived experience in the world.

Influenced by their intuitive absorption and direct engagement with the cultural moment in time that they live in, they create new stories for the rest of us to use as bridges to meaning and understanding in the maelstrom of confusion that can surround us.

Whether a shark floating in a glass tank of formaldehyde by Damien Hirst, or an Assyrian sculpture of a deity-king, both deal with the same elements — scale, weight, form, color, mass, texture, movement, buoyancy, contrast, energy, power, and humor. Join the conversation and ask the questions, to move yourself
