A former Darien police youth officer and a knowledgeable social worker will participate in an online book club discussion.

Participants are invited to read at their own pace, and thought-provoking questions will be posted each week on the Our Darien Facebook page ([www.facebook.com/OurDarien](http://www.facebook.com/OurDarien), click "Groups") to enhance the reader's experience.

A live book discussion on Thursday, May 20th at 10:00am via Zoom will feature Tracey Masella, licensed clinical social worker in affiliation with Silver Hill Hospital, who will offer her perspective on teen substance use, peer pressure and parental boundary setting.

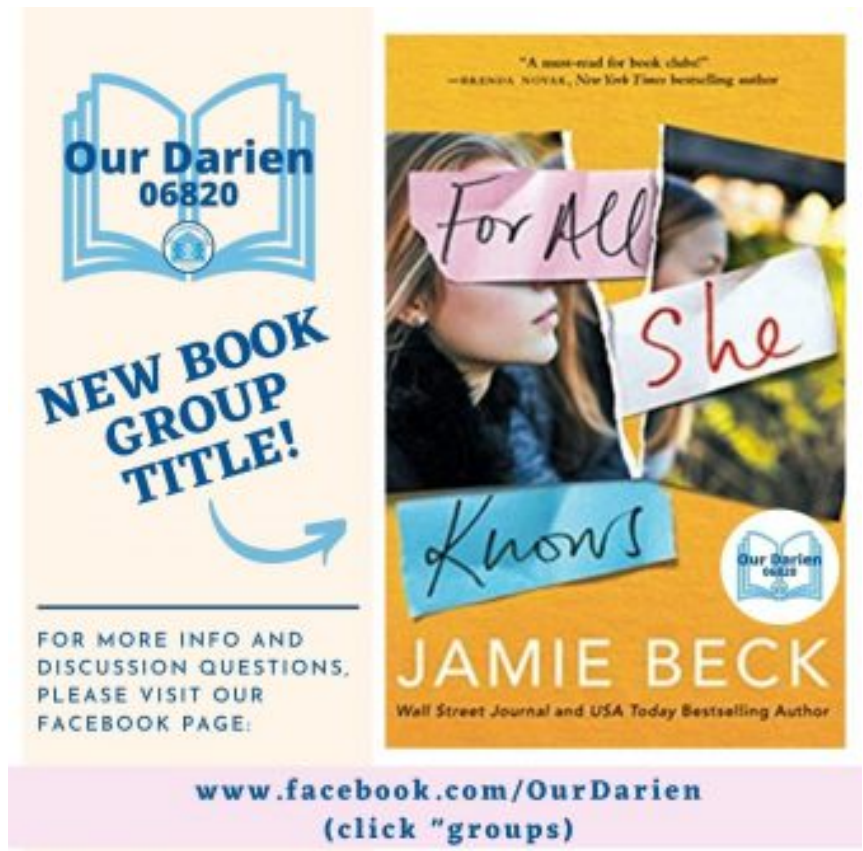

#### **Description of the Novel**



Two mothers face the consequences of their choices in a gripping novel about friendship, family, and forgiveness. Grace first met Mimi when she blew into their sons' toddler playgroup like a warm bay breeze that loosened Grace's tight spaces.

Despite differing approaches to life and parenting, the fast friends raised their kids together while cementing a sisterlike bond that neither believed could be broken. But when a string of ill-fated decisions results in a teen party with a tragic outcome for Grace's son, the friendship is ripped apart and an already-splintered community explodes.
