Ciannella is the director of neonatology at Stamford Health and is a fellowship-trained and board-certified neonatologist.

Since 2008 he has been caring for newborn infants and those who are premature or diagnosed with complex medical and rare conditions and those who are critically ill.

Ciannella oversees the care and development of newborns and premature babies, diagnosing congenital conditions such as airway birth defects, kidney defects, lung development conditions and other complex conditions.

He utilizes advanced technologies and new pharmaceutical therapies to improve survival and quality of life. Ciannella also treats neonatal emergencies that arise either during or after birth and those who are transported to the hospital or transferred from other hospitals.

He is an expert in treating the most-high risk, complex newborns, including those born premature.

As director of neonatology, Ciannella led an initiative to include more physician assistants and neonatal nurse practitioners within the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) team.

During his free time, Ciannella enjoys staying active through sports, exercise and outdoor activities with his family and friends. He lives in Wilton.

Joseph A. Vitterito II

Joseph Vitterito is the chair of the Department of Pediatrics and chief of the Division of Neonatology at St. Vincent's Medical Center, a division of Hartford Healthcare. He is also fellowship-trained and board-certified in Neonatal/Perinatal Medicine.

He is the author of several publications including the children's books "My Brother is a Premie" and "My Sister is a Premie."

A board certified in neonatal/perinatal medicine, Vitterito previously worked at Elliot Hospital in Manchester, New Hampshire, where he was an attending neonatologist of a 31-bed Level III unit.

He has also served as an attending Neonatologist at the Juan F. Luis Hospital in Christiansted, U.S. Virgin Islands, providing neonatology services in their Level II/III nursery at the only hospital on St. Croix. Vitterito provided essential services prior to, during and after the latest hurricanes impacting the island in the fall of 2017.
