Area residents are invited to a public meeting about noise from train horns on the New Canaan Branch, state Rep. Matt Blumenthal has announced.

The Jan. 27 meeting at the Harry Bennett Branch of Ferguson Library in Springdale, will include state Transportation Commissioner Joseph Giulietti, representatives from the state Transportation Department and from Metro-North Railroad as well as state legislators.

Blumenthal announced the meeting in an email to constituents.

Earlier this fall, I told you about efforts I was making with the Connecticut Department of Transportation to reduce train-horn noise along the New Canaan Branch, and that we'd have a town-hall-style forum where you could discuss the issue with representatives of DOT and Metro-North Railroad.

I'm glad to announce that that forum will take place on Monday, Jan. 27, from 6 to 7 p.m., at the Harry Bennett Branch of the Ferguson Library in Stamford. We will be joined by DOT Commissioner Joe Giulietti and a representative of Metro-North, as well as a number of my colleagues from the General Assembly.

I hope you will attend. DOT, Metro-North, and I need your perspective to ensure we achieve the highest quality of life possible while still ensuring public safety.
