Worst Health Inspection Rating — 'C' — for Two Darien Establishments in Latest Reports

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A restaurant and a retirement home in Darien received "C" ratings, the worst grade in town Health Department's A/B/C ratings system, in the inspection reports released Thursday by the Darien Health Department.

Meanwhile, a retirement home that previously received a "C" rating has now received an "A" and a perfect 100 score in its latest inspection.

The department released health inspection reports for 11 food-serving establishments on Thursday for

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inspections that took place from Sept. 4 to 9. In addition to the two "C" rating, five inspections resulted in an "A," another four establishments each received a "B."

Maplewood at Darien, which received a "C" in a previous inspection, was reinspected and received not only an "A" rating, but a perfect 100 in the state health rating scorecard — which means no violations whatever were found.

Keep in mind that a food-serving establishment with a history of good ratings may occasionally get a poor inspection rating, occasionally the best do, and every restaurant normally gets a few things wrong.

- —Atria Darien 50 Ledge Road Sept. 22 Town Rating: C State Score: 86 *Inspector's Remarks:* "Food in small bain-marie out of temperature (tuna salad at 51 [degrees], chicken salad at 53, ham at 51, and (lower area) chowder at 53 degrees (food product must be stored at 41 or below); food uncovered around the kitchen and in storage refrigeration (chips, bacon, ham, vegetables); rolling cart cannot block the hand sink on the cook line, a warning was issued during the last routine inspection to discontinue this practice; unclean utensils in storage (knife and ladle); areas on the line

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unclean, near grill and fryer; leak at sink on the stoye." — Inspector's comments: "A couple minor corrects made on-site during inspection, hand-washing reminder for all staff, small service area fridge at 51 degrees (individual creamers and small half-and-half container), masks and gloves worn by kitchen staff, COVID-19 discussions, screening, tables distanced, some room delivery, no pub operation."

—Hibachi Sushi Ya — 111 Old Kings Hwy. North — Sept. 23 — Town Rating: C — State Score: 79 — Inspector's Remarks: "Sushi rice not logged for time holding; sink against spice rack without barrier; foods on cooler and freezer floors; using bowls as scoops; personal items stored with foods and dishware; dirty wiping cloths on counters; dirty vegetable sliders, dirty and rusty seaweed tin; seaweed tin dirty; scoops and bowls stored in tubs of foods; torn gaskets on coolers; underside of shelves dirty; gap under rear door; floor tiles cracked in some areas; walls, ceilings, coving in disrepair and dirty; gap under rear door; rear area still cluttered, but improved." — Inspector's comments: "Made some progress."

EDITOR'S NOTE: Hibachi Sushi Ya received "C" ratings in other recent inspections. This most recent inspection asserts many violations that were asserted in the previous health inspection, although the inspector commented that there was "some progress."

The restaurant's most recent "C" rating (reported here) was on Sept. 9. Hibachi Sushi Ya also received a "C" rating in February 2019 and in July 2019. In October 2019, Darienite.com noted that the restaurant received "C" ratings four times in seven inspections.

SChools). When we provide that information here, then words within brackets ("[]") have been added for
clarity by Darienite.com; semicolons (";") separate individual comments by the inspectors. Each comment
separated by semicolons is about a particular violation that triggers a deduction of one or more points from
a perfect state score of 100.

How Darien's Food-Serving Places Are Rated

Restaurants in town are rated under the Darien Health Department's own A/B/C ratings system. Health inspectors also use the state health code regulations to score restaurants, with a perfect score set at 100, and demerits (of 1 to 4 points each) for various code violations.

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The Darien system takes into account problems that are ongoing, so a restaurant scoring higher than others on the state scale may actually get a lower score on the Darien scale.

Any establishment actually deemed unsafe can be closed by the town Health Department until violations are fixed. Town Health Director David Knauf says that has never happened in the time he's been with the department.

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
